The Position

The Qualifications

- Be able to create and articulate a vision for the school district aligned with a results oriented strategic plan that will move the district forward to a new level.
- Demonstrates an ability to work in a small community and have an understanding, appreciation and respect for the community.
- Experienced in working in a growing community and demonstrated success with bonds and levies.

Note: It is preferred that the superintendent be a resident of the Ridgefield School District; and it would be desirable that the superintendent has, or be eligible for, a Washington State Superintendent credential.

The Community

Ridgefield is a small, but growing community situated along the Interstate 5 corridor in Clark County, Washington, north of Vancouver and 14 miles north of Portland, Oregon.



As a community, Ridgefield strives to manage growth while maintaining the friendliness and spirit of a small town. The old fashioned downtown creates a welcoming Main Street charm. The residents of Ridgefield come from diverse economic and educational backgrounds. Multiple generations of the same families have lived in Ridgefield establishing a strong tradition of community and school pride.

The picturesque National Wildlife Refuge located on the shore of the Lower Columbia River is a 5,217 acre spread of rolling hills and tranquil setting. It is also the home of historic Cathlapotle town site which was visited by the Lewis and Clark expedition.

The District

The Ridgefield School District has approximately 2,200 students, K-12. There are approximately 165 staff members, 8 building and district administrative staff, 106 certified teachers and 53 classified staff members. The district covers 57.5 square miles of farmland, suburban residential communities, and the city of Ridgefield.

The assessed valuation for the district is \$1,905,391,000 with an operating budget of \$20,350,000. The district currently has an unreserved fund balance of \$532,000.

The Ridgefield School District offers a comprehensive curriculum in Language Arts, Math, Social Studies, Science, Art, Foreign Language, Physical Education, Health, Fine and Performing Arts, and Career/ Technical Education. There are also Advanced Placement courses in Calculus, Chemistry, Government, History, Literature and Composition. The district has access to the Clark County Skills Center as well. There are programs for Special Education, Transitional Bilingual Education, Running Start, Alternative Education, Credit Recovery and a full range of extracurricular activities and athletics.



Board of Directors

The Board of Directors consists of five board members, each elected to serve a four-year term. The incumbency of the members ranges from newly elected to 6 years.
