The Community



The community is nestled in the Madison, Milwaukee, and Chicago economic triangle, one of the largest metropolitan regions in the Midwest. The community of 12,500 is only 30 minutes from Madison, one hour from Milwaukee, and two hours from Chicago with ready access to Interstates 90, 94, 39 and 43, as well as US Highway 12 and State Highways 26, 89, and 106. Fort Atkinson's convenient proximity to these key metropolitan areas makes it an ideal place for growing businesses while maintaining a small town quality of life including affordable housing, great schools, and access to cultural events.

Fort Atkinson is an excellent combination of a small town that features all of the amenities of a larger city. Because Fort Atkinson is surrounded by beautiful Wisconsin countryside, all roads leading to Fort Atkinson from larger, convenient metropolitan cities are the scenic route.

The community of Fort Atkinson is very committed to finer education as evidenced by passage of two referendums by large margins over the last three years, and four within the past decade.

Some of the industries have existed for over 100 years. Consistent, well-planned growth and responsible municipal administration have contributed to steady industrial expansion. Cooperation among the City, the Chamber of Commerce, and the Industrial Development Corporation has created a business-friendly community.

Fort Atkinson benefits from proximity to three University of Wisconsin system universities (UW Madison, UW Milwaukee, and UW Whitewater) and features a branch of Madison Area Technical College within city limits.





The School District of Fort Atkinson is large enough to have "big city" educational resources, yet small enough to provide "small town" personalized instruction.

The district has six schools - four neighborhood elementary schools, a middle school, and a high school. In addition, the District provides

four-year-old-kindergarten through a community partnership approach. At all grade levels, the District is dedicated to helping students advance socially and emotionally as well as achieve academically. The District's programming is comprehensive and inclusive of the core disciplines of English/language arts, math, science, and social studies, as well as elective offerings in art, drama, music (instrumental and vocal), technology education (including STEM programming), agricultural education, family and consumer education, business education, and world language.

As students progress through our system, increasing classes are focused on career pathways and post-high school opportunities for students to aspire toward. Advanced Placement courses are available to

college-bound students offering the opportunity to secure college credits while still in high school. Dual credit and/or articulated course offerings are offered providing students with technical school

aspirations a similar head-start in coursework. Annually, Fort Atkinson students earn over half a million dollars in post-secondary scholarships both from local and external sources.

The staff, comprised of highly qualified educators many with degrees and credits beyond a Master's degree, works to meet the needs of all learners. The District works closely with parents and provides frequent communication regarding student progress and development to families. Differentiation, culturally-responsive practices, and an inclusive environment are integral parts of our education system.

An application for District Superintendent should include:

- A letter setting forth personal qualifications, experiences and reasons for interest in the position
- A current résumé
- A completed application form
- Reference letters, certificates and licenses, and academic transcripts from colleges/universities indicating degree(s)
