The Position

- An earned doctorate is preferred but not required for the superintendent.

The Community

Starkville, Mississippi, with 25,366 residents, is located about 127 miles from Jackson, MS, 26 miles from Columbus, MS, 68 miles from Tupelo, MS and 97 miles from Meridian, MS.

The state's largest public university, which happens to be one of the major employers of the area is Mississippi State University.

Medical facilities available in the area include OCH Regional Medical Center, Baptist Hospital in Columbus, MS, and Northeast Mississippi Medical Center in Tupelo, MS.

There are seven city parks in the area that include two swimming pools, tennis and racquetball courts, baseball, softball, and soccer fields, and play areas for small children. Noxubee National Wildlife Refuge is located 13 miles south of Starkville.

A very active community, Starkville is known as the cultural epicenter where numerous concerts and

performances by local and visiting artists is a regular event. The most popular events in the area include the Cotton District Arts Festival and Taste of Starkville. These events are the largest annual celebration of art and culture. - A current résumé
- A completed application form
- Reference letters, certificates and licenses, and academic transcripts from colleges/universities indicating degree(s)
