The Position

The Community

Wellsville is located right off I-35 in the northeast corner of Franklin County, less than 20 miles south of the Kansas City area. Two communities Wellsville residents access frequently are Gardner, 10 miles to the north, and Olathe, 15 miles to the north. Ottawa is also 10 miles south of Wellsville. The easy access to I-35 is one of Wellsville biggest assets.

Local medical facilities include a doctor's office and a chiropractor. Hospitals are located nearby in Ottawa and Olathe. Wellsville also has a pharmacy.

Community activities include the Wellsville Car Show in August. Wellsville Days is held the third weekend in September, with a festival, parade, various vendors and live entertainment. Attending the high school football and basketball games also bring the community together.

Golfers can enjoy golf courses located in Ottawa. Outdoor enthusiasts can enjoy boating, camping, fishing, swimming, a firing range, and walking paths at the Hillsdale State Lake and Park located 15 miles east of the city. Sledding is a favorite activity whenever it snows. Children enjoy swimming in the city pool and going to the library during the summer.



Residents can travel to nearby Kansas City to enjoy professional sports by watching the Kansas City Royals and the Kansas City Chiefs. Both stadiums are a 30-minute drive from Wellsville.

Higher educational opportunities are available from Baker University in Baldwin (seven miles northwest of Wellsville). The campus is old and beautiful with onsite housing. Also located nearby are Ottawa University and Neosho County Community College.

The District


Wellsville USD 289 has an enrollment of 782 students. There are 102 staff members, 5 administrators, 55 certificated teachers, and 42 classified staff members.

For athletic and activities participation, Wellsville High School is classified at 3A by the Kansas State High School Activities Association. In addition to sports, the district provides numerous music opportunities, academic clubs, and non-academic clubs.




The district partners with the Neosho County Community College, and Anderson Community College for vocational study programs. Students have the opportunity to replace high school classes during their junior and senior years with

- Reference letters, certificates and licenses, and academic transcripts from colleges/universities indicating degree(s)
