THE POSITION:

The Cotopaxi Consolidated Schools, Cotopaxi, Colorado, School Board, is seeking a highly qualified **Superintendent**. The Board wishes to have the successful candidate assume the responsibilities of the position July 1, 2024.

Location: Cotopaxi lies on both sides of the Arkansas River, 33 miles (53 km) west of Cañon City, the county seat, and 25 miles (40 km) southeast of Salida. It is about 150 miles south of Denver.

The candidate must have the background, skills, and abilities essential for excellence in educational leadership.

- Passionate: A person who is focused on student achievement while meeting the needs of all students. A person who understands and has high regard for small rural agricultural communities. One who has the ability to create a common vision, establish goals and follow through with results. Able to inspire others.
- Leader: A leader with a history of consistently demonstrating honesty, integrity, ethical treatment of others. A person who has an open and collaborative management style. A person with the ability to develop a shared vision for the future of the district with the strength and conviction to follow through and make tough decisions.
- Communicator: A leader with strong communication skills
 who listens to both the school and greater community. A
 person who speaks and writes with clarity and is able to
 communicate tough and difficult issues in a positive manner.
 A person who is comfortable with radio and newspapers as
 well as social media.
- Manager: A leader with successful fiscal management skills including school finance, budgeting and equitable allocation of funds and creativity in seeking additional forms of revenue. A person who knows how to manage a system focused on improvement. One who has the ability to work effectively with the school board.

Cotopaxi has its own football and baseball fields, and boasts a long heritage of community support for athletics.

We offer trade certificates within industrial arts and facilitate concurrent courses through Pueblo Community College, empowering students with practical skills and advanced learning opportunities. Athletically, we compete under the Colorado High School Activities Association (CHSSA), and compete in football, volleyball, track, and baseball at the 1A level, and basketball at the 2A level. Our cultural programs feature middle and high school bands, guitar classes, and unique offerings in German, automotive, and welding courses.

In Cotopaxi, small class sizes translate to individualized student support and enriched engagement, creating the groundwork for emotional and educational advocacy that rivals larger districts.

THE COMMUNITY:

Cotopaxi is situated between Salida and Canon City in the scenic Bighorn Sheep Canyon. The town radiates rural charm with its general store and cafe, a Post Office, a church, and a museum that celebrates our rich local history. Serving around 3,000 residents, the district also encompasses the communities of Howard, Coaldale and Texas Creek.

In the Cotopaxi area, life is balanced between the tranquility of a rural community and the accessibility of urban amenities. Salida (25 miles) and Canon City (35 miles), our neighboring towns, are not just scenic backdrops but hubs



of convenience. Both towns boast multiple well-stocked grocery chains, catering to daily shopping needs. For those occasions when you seek more extensive retail therapy, larger cities on the Front Range are just an hour and half drive away, offering a broader array of shopping experiences. Pueblo (72 miles) and Colorado Springs (79 miles), with their airports, are just a day trip away, while Denver International Airport (163 miles) connects us to the wider world.

The majority of our residents find their professional callings in the neighboring towns, with the robust prison system in Canon City standing out as a significant employer. Salida's Heart of the Rockies Regional Medical Center and St. Thomas More Hospital in Canon City are both within reasonable distance, ensuring that medical care is always accessible.



Our area is an adventurer's paradise, offering hiking, biking, rafting, hunting, and more. Just an hour away, the Monarch Ski Area beckons with its pristine slopes, perfect for both beginners and seasoned skiers. Meanwhile, Canon City, renowned for its rich geological landscapes, offers a unique opportunity to explore the world of dinosaur fossils and the Royal Gorge Bridge and Park.

Salida, with its vibrant cultural scene, hosts the famous FIBark rafting festival and the enchanting annual Christmas parade that lights up Christmas Mountain. These events bring together the community and visitors in a celebration of local traditions and natural beauty. These communities thrive with local farmers' markets in the summer and craft fairs in the winter, showcasing the talents and produce of our local artisans, farmers and ranchers.

Further enhancing our community's educational landscape, we're in close proximity to esteemed institutions like Pueblo Community College, Colorado Mountain College, Colorado State University Pueblo, and the University of Colorado-Colorado Springs.
